


## ADMISSIONS BY JOSHUA HARMON

#### A WORD (OR TWO, OR MORE) FROM THE DIRECTOR

Joshua Harmon's ADMISSIONS was written well before the Operation Varsity Blues scandal broke earlier this year, although one might rightly assume that some sort of cheating, or at least bending of rules regarding college admissions, has probably been going on for quite some time. But Harmon's play is not focused on prestigious learning institutions themselves, or even a greater network of parental influence or newsworthy scandal, but rather on one particular family and their attempts to get their son into Yale. Harmon himself says that the play is not really about applying to college; he calls that the "container...to be able to ask the larger questions with which the play is trying to engage. At its core, this play is an examination of whiteness: white privilege, white power, white anxiety, white guilt, all of it."

In the play, Bill Mason, the headmaster of a New Hampshire prep school, and his wife Sherri, the admissions officer, are trying to achieve greater diversity in the student body; while their son, Charlie, begins to question both the validity the admission processes, and his own future as a "white male," satirically unravelling the "woke" liberalism he's been raised to abide by.

Harmon says: "...in real life, most people are not all good or all evil. Most of us live somewhere in between those two extremes, whether or not we like to admit we do. I wanted to try and capture an aspect of race as it pertains to white people that I'd never seen onstage before, one which presents white people who live in that grey area, and doesn't delineate between clear villains and saints. Many times in stories with white casts, the audience is not overtly asked to contemplate race, as if the story being told exists outside of that discussion. I wanted to write a play where the characters' whiteness was actually a defining factor, where we see their whiteness and contemplate it openly."

At the heart of the play is an expectation, and an examination of that expectation: the expectation that many white, upper and upper-middle class families have come to perceive as their right: a right to the best opportunities, to be able to reach their full potential, a right to a seat at the table. Are they the best? Or have they just had the best advantages?
