

The musical's exploration of themes revolve around racial tensions, physical disabilities, and the differences that are not always visible to the naked eye. The incredible cast of "freaks" we meet throughout the work, drive this idea home as well.

But who are the true "freaks?" Though social media and technology have changed the ways we gawk at those different than us, we still want to watch, and more importantly, comment.

Daisy and Violet are like everybody else. They are our friends, our sisters, our mothers, our next-door neighbors. They want everything we want. And they teach us. They teach us to keep around the people who "will love you as you are."

You came to look at the freaks. You came to see a show, and by golly, you are going to get one. Sit back, relax, and welcome to the Side Show!

In a world of increasing hostility and division, it's the job of art to pick up where our schools, courthouses and even churches are leaving off. What does it mean to separate humans into categories of "normal" and "the other." From football, to scholarship, to our neighborhoods, to religion, to politics, to war; as a community we are quickly becoming subject matter experts on what it means to (at best) dehumanize those around us and (at worse) institutionalize those distinctions.

"See what Hollywood seeks," Daisy sings, and it stings a little. Because she turns the mirror back on us. For their story is ours as well.

Historical Timeline

February 5, 1908 Daisy & Violet are born to Kate Skinner in Brighton England. It was reported that they were the first conjoined twins born in the UK who survived more than a few weeks.

1911 "The United Twins" toured Britain. Mary Hilton, "Auntie," procured the twins after aiding in their birth. The twins also toured Germany and Australia.

1916 "The Hilton Twins" toured America.

1926 Bob Hope danced with the twins as "Dancemedians."

1931 The twins sued their managers: Mary's daughter Edith and her husband Meyer Meyers. They won their freedom.

1932 The twins starred in the film Freaks.

1936 Violet married gay actor James Moore as a publicity stunt.

1941 A second publicity stunt: Daisy married Harold Estep, known as dancer Buddy Sawyer, who was also gay.

1951 The twins starred in *Chained for Life*, an exploitation film loosely based on their lives.

1961 They took a job at a grocery store in Charlotte, North Carolina.

January, 4 1969 the twins died of Hong Kong Flu in NC; first Daisy, then Violet four days later.

October 16, 1997 Side Show opened at the Richard Rodgers Theater.

In 2012, Leslie Zemeckis filmed a documentary, Bound by Flesh, about the sisters' lives.

November 17, 2014, having undergone re-writes, *Side Show's* revival opened at the St. James Theater on Broadway.

Steve Williams (Technical Director/Set Design/Houdini) is happy to return to the role of Houdini, which he also played in Ragtime (ZACH). On the other side of the curtain, he is excited to work on this show as a designer. Steve's been performing at TSP since 2011, but coming on as Technical Director in 2017, Steve designed both Kindertransport and J'oy Vey. Other design credits include: Blood Brothers (TSP), Tarzan, A Funny Thing Happened..., The Wizard of Oz, and Cabaret (Georgetown Palace).



Paul Pew (Music Director) is a veteran of scores of shows #pun and is excited to be working with Trinity Street Players for the first time. He has directed Cabaret, Phantom, Singin' in the Rain, Cyrano, Next to Normal, Sondheim on Sondheim, Evita, Parade, Last Five Years, Secret Garden, Bonnie and Clyde, Fantasticks and Showboat back in 1980. He teaches math at McCallum High School, where he is also active in the theater program, and sings with Conspirare.



Adam Roberts (Choreographer) is thrilled to return to Trinity Street Players! Adam is Senior Creative Director at Shalom Austin, Producing Artistic Director of the Austin Jewish Repertory Theater, Co-Founding Artistic Director of TILT Performance Group, and Director of Music at St. Luke United Methodist Church. He holds a master's degree in music from the Florida State University and an Executive Certificate in Arts & Culture Strategy from the University of Pennsylvania/National Arts Strategies. Colleen PowerGriffin (Costume Designer) has designed, draped, and run wardrobe for educational, regional, and touring productions. As a draper, Colleen has developed and built costumes for ZACH, Zilker Summer Musicals, Texas State University, St. Edward's University, UT Austin, UT Arlington, Harris Costumes Fort Worth, Jaston Williams, and The Old Globe Theatre in San Diego.



Scott Ferguson (Sound Designer), is both designer and performer. 
