PRODUCTION BIOS

Don Toner (Producing Artistic Director) founded Austin Playhouse in 2000. Before that he was Producing Artistic Director of the State Theatre Company/Live Oak Theatre for thirteen years. Prior to coming to Austin he was Associate Producer for the inaugural season of the Los Angeles Theatre Center, Associate Producer/Director of the Cincinnati Playhouse in the Park for three seasons, and he founded Theatre Center of Mississippi; the state's first Equity theatre. He has also produced and directed at New Stage Theatre, Bucks County Playhouse, Theatre Midland, and Theatre Four in New York City. Steven Dietz (playwright) Steven Dietz's thirty-plus plays have been seen at over one hundred regional theatres in the United States, as well as Off-Broadway and in twenty countries internationally. Recent world premieres include Bloomsday (2016 Steinberg New Play Award Citation); This Random World (2016 Humana Festival of New American Plays); and On Clover Road (National New Play Network "rolling world premiere"). Current projects include an intimate thriller, The Shimmering; and two interconnected plays for adult and youth audiences, The Great Beyond and The Ghost of Splinter Cove. Mr. Dietz is married to playwright Allison Gregory. They divide their time between Seattle and Austin, where he teaches playwriting and directing at the University of Texas.
