The work of Sam Shepard

Buried Child premiered in 1978 and marked a turning point in Sam Shepard's career when it became the first Off-Off Broadway play to win the Pulitzer Prize. The play was hailed as a comical and insightful presentation of the disintegrating American dream that was happening all across the country's rural landscape. With its success, his plays were in great demand. In the next ten years he created commercial successes like True West, Fool for Love, and A Lie of the Mind. He is a playwright, screenwriter, actor, and director of stage and screen. He has written over thirty plays and is the author of several books of short stories, essays and memoirs. As a film actor, he is perhaps best known for his portrayal of legendary test pilot Chuck Yeager in The Right Stuff.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

This is the part where I'm supposed to say what a huge Sam Shepherd fan I am, right? Well, in all honesty, I am. However, I had not read this script until last year (how many theatre scholars would even admit that?), and it's now running neck and neck with *True West* as my favorite of Shepherd's work.

Consistent throughout his writing is the underbelly of the American Dream. In *Buried Child*, he attacks the very cornerstone of that idea; family. The challenge is not only the confrontational subject matter, but also the mixture of realism and surrealism that populates this play. What is real, and what is fiction? Who in this family is telling the truth, if anyone? It's a popular notion that everyone's family is crazy; they're the people you love not only in *spite* of their insanity, but often *because* of it. No one can explain what connects you other than blood and some kind of deep, instinctual need for a "pack", as it were.

Buried Child won't make you feel warm and fuzzy about your family. I'd be hard-pressed to say it would make you feel that way about anything. It will however, strip away the apple pie, the picket fences, and the "whistle-while-you-work" mentality of farm life and explore the darkest aspects of the American Family, the need for recognition in a sea of faces and chaos, and the painful re-emergence of truth as it rips mendacity away like an extra-strength band-aid. As to whether or not the truth shall always set you free, I will leave that to you, friends. Enjoy the show.
