



Some of her favorite theatre experiences have been touring with singin's sensations The CowPattys and her one-woman show GOIN's TO GEORGIA, and doing theatre for youth in statewide artist residencies and here in Austin with productions like THE GIRL PROJECT. I am excited to be back on stage!

NATALIE GARCIA (Midge) | Natalie is honored to be working with Street Corner Arts for the first time! Natalie is originally from Chicaaaahhhgo, where she worked as an actor, writer, and producer before moving to Austin in 2016. You may have seen her recently as Fefu in FEFU AND HER FRIENDS (Filigree), Lise in THE MAGIC FIRE (Different Stages), Vanessa in SIGNIFICANT OTHER (Jarrott Productions), or as part of the ensemble in SELF PORTRAITS (Bottle Alley Theatre). GREG GINTHER (Donal) | Greg is excited to be performing again. THE BUTCHER OF BARABOO is his third foray into the Austin theater scene and thinks this play is going to be funny as hell. Most recent productions, YANKEE TAVERN and THE MAGIC FIRE. Some folks even nominated him for a B. Iden Payne award for his performance as Otto in THE MAGIC FIRE. WHAT??? She would also like to thank her amazing fiancé for continually supporting her and taking care of their zoo of animals while she has been away rehearsing.

AMBER QUICK (Gail) | Amber is so excited to return to the Hyde Park stage for her second Street Corner Arts production. She was last seen here as Tammy in POCATELLO. Actor, Singer, Musician, and lover of all things production; she can be seen on and off many stages around Austin. A certified Actor Combatant with the Society of American Fight Directors (SAFD) since 2001, he is a full-time fight and movement teacher at Texas State University.
