From the Director

first saw a barebones staged reading of THE DROWSY CHAPERONE in the Fall of 2004 at the National Alliance for Musical Theater (NAMT) Festival. Immediately drawn into a love letter to the world of musicals, I knew I was seeing something special. As the "Man in Chair" – the narrator of the play – began to speak the opening words, I realized that I was that character! I heard him say out loud the things I had been thinking for years. His passion for the fictional show THE DROWSY CHAPERONE ignited my own passion for the story that was unfolding. I was drawn into this crazy, silly, "musical within a musical" – and was completely enthralled.

After that presentation, the show found its way to Broadway and went on to win five Tony Awards. A while later, I had the opportunity to be a producer of the first National Tour of the show. I was thrilled to be making my commercial producing debut with a musical that I loved so dearly. And now here at ZACH, I am directing it for the very first time.

When Dave Steakley – who I coincidentally met at NAMT – called and asked me to come direct this production, one of the first questions I asked myself was "Why do audiences connect with this show?" The answer is quite simple really. "The Man" represents anyone who has ever acted in a production, played in the pit, worked backstage or in a box office, or has sat in a theater seat to watch a show. His love of THE DROWSY CHAPERONE mirrors our own love for theatre; it reflects our lives, stretches our imagination and brings us considerable joy. My hope is that this production — with its infectious score, fun book, talented cast and wonderful dance numbers — will fuel your passion for the theater, the way this show has fueled mine during the past six years.

ELISBETH CHALLENER (Managing Director) – joined ZACH Theatre as Managing Director in 2007 after having served as a non-profit consultant and the Executive Director of One World Theatre since moving to Austin. As ZACH's Managing Director, Elisbeth is responsible for a \$20M capital campaign towards the building of a new theatre as well as the management,

development and finances of the organization. Under her guidance ZACH has just completed a Five Year Strategic Plan that will move the organization into the next phase of its significant expansion. Prior to Austin, she resided in the San Francisco bay area where she was Montalvo Arts Center's Executive Director, spending nearly 20 years with the organization. As Executive Director, Elisbeth led Montalvo's growth from a small, community-based organization into a major presenting venue and home to an internationally acclaimed artists' residency program. Other accomplishments during her tenure included increasing ticket sales from less than \$500K to more than \$4 million, expanding the patron base from 6,000 to 80,000, and raising more than \$20 million for capital projects. Earlier in her career, she served as Administrative Director for the San Francisco Boys Chorus, Education/Outreach Director of the Fairmount Theatre of the Deaf, and as department chair and faculty member of the performing arts department of The Purnell School in New Jersey. Elisbeth graduated from the Boston Conservatory of Music with a bachelor's degree in fine arts in drama and musical theatre. She attended the Harvard Business School Executive Education Program, Center for Excellence in Nonprofit Management Leaders Institute in San Jose, Calif. and served in leadership roles for the American Leadership Forum, Silicon Valley, Saratoga Rotary Club, Junior League of San Jose and the Downtown Austin Alliance Parks Committee. She is currently serving on the National Alliance of Musical Theatre's Festival of New Musicals Committee, Elisbeth has always had a passion for the theatre and performed for many years in summer stock, dinner theatre, and semi-professional productions on the east coast and in California.

Allen is an award-winning musical director, playwright, actor, director, sound designer and musician, and has worked on hundreds of productions from Chicago to Japan and just about everywhere in between. Additionally, he is a composer with

credits including the documentary film *Beyond Black Rock*, the musical *Jouet* and the ballet *Secret Garden*.



ROBIN LEWIS (Choreographer) – is a twelve-year Broadway and national Broadway touring veteran. At ZACH Theater, he has choreographed Porgy and Bess, Urinetown: The Musical, High School Musical, Jesucristo Superestrella/Jesus Christ Superstar, and The Rocky Horror Show.
