

About the Playwright - OLGA MUKHINA - With the end of the Soviet Union in 1991 came tremendous upheaval in Russian society, and the prevailing opinion that no new plays were being written. Enter Olga Mukhina - a mysterious and fiercely independent playwriting student from Moscow, who emerged in 1997 with a reading of her first play, TANYA-TANYA. Within a year of its premiere at Moscow's Fomenko Studio, TANYA-TANYA was translated into five languages; the Moscow production toured Poland, Germany and Bulgaria; later, American professional practitioners and students took on Mukhina's work, and TANYA-TANYA has been staged at the Towson University MFA Program in Theatre, as well as the California Institute of the Arts School of Theater in LA, Californa. As for Mukhina's work in Russia, her second professional premiere came with her play, "YoU," which premiered at the Moscow Art Theatre in 2001. Some critics argue that Mukhina's debut helped kick off a spectacularly productive period in Russian theater, often referred to as the New Drama Movement. Said playwright Mikhail Ugarov, "Olga Mukhina is the Little Red Riding Hood of contemporary Russian drama. She had the nerve to go out there in the woods, not fearing the wolf."

About the Translator – JOHN FREEDMAN is an American critic, translator, writer, and theater producer living in Moscow, Russia. The author or translator/editor of nine books about Russian theater, he has been the theater critic of The Moscow Times since 1992 and a monthly columnist for Plays International since 1994. He was the Russian director of The New Russian Drama: Translation/Production/Conference, from 2007 to 2010, a project hosted by Towson University, Baltimore, Md., and Philip Arnoult S Center for International Theater Development (CITD) from 2007 to 2010. Freedman is the director of the emerging American Plays for Russia, supported by the Center for International Theatre Development and the US Russia Bi-lateral Presidential Commission. This project will result in translations, readings, and productions throughout the Russian Federation of a cross-section of America smost important contemporary dramatic works.

About FLYING (2005): A group of Russia's so-called "golden youth," smart, talented, well-heeled twenty-somethings are heading for disaster. Among them are DJs, VJs, PR agents and on-screen presenters for a hot new youth-oriented Moscow television production company. These people, with hip-sounding names like Snowstorm, Maniac, Snowflake and Orangina, are creating and living the images that will define the future. None wastes much time thinking about why one of their group is repeatedly battered by her husband or why another constantly takes tranquilizers to maintain her cool, collected image. But when an unsullied teenage girl joins their group one day, they are compelled to look beyond the usual limits of their purview. And when Snowstorm is arrested for possession of drugs and Orangina undergoes a religious experience, the insular nature of their world is quickly breached.

Thanks to generous support from the **Center for International Theater Development** and its director, **Philip Arnoult**, two of Russia's most prominent and important contemporary playwrights will be present for the premiere: Maksym Kurochkin and Olga Mukhina.

This translation of FLYING was workshopped at the Towson University MFA in Theatre Program, during its 2009-2010 New Russian Drama Season.
