### CAST BIOS

Susan Brogdon (Bertha) is happy to be concluding a busy theatre season by making her first appearance at Classic Theatre. She recently performed in Unnecessary Farce at the Vex and in the San Pedro Playfest. Favorite past productions include Female Transport, The Women, Ah, Wilderness!, Steel Magnolias, A Streetcar Named Desire, and The Heiress. Susan received an ATAC Globe nomination for Picnic and Outstanding Performance by an Actress honors from the US Army Festival of the Performing Arts for Catfish Moon.

Asia Ciaravino (Hedda) is a co-Founder of the Classic Theatre. Last seen on the Classic stage as Beatrice in *Much Ado About Nothing*, she graduated with a BA in Theatre from Incarnate Word. After college she worked as an actor in theatre and television in Minneapolis, Lansing, San Antonio, Austin and toured with a children's theatre group across the Midwest. Some of her favorite roles include: Circe in *The Odyssey*, Nora in *A Dolls House*, Lady Macbeth in *Macbeth*, Constanza in *Amadeus*, Woman in *BASH*, Lady Capulet in *Romeo and Juliet*, Miss Nelson in *Miss Nelson is Missing* and Izzy in *Rabbit Hole*.

**Eric Geyer** (*Eilert Loevborg*) is honored to be involved in his first Classic Theatre production. His local theatrical credits include *As Bees in Honey Drown* (Evan Weiler) and *Fuddy Meers* (Kenny) at San Pedro Playhouse. He is currently completing his 11th year as a teacher at Saint Mary's Hall where he founded the Speech, Debate, and Competitive Drama program in 2002 and would like to personally thank his students for inspiring him to jump on stage once again. He is the author of more than 20 plays (2 of which have been performed at Jump Start) and has enjoyed more than 50 productions of his work all over North America.

Allan S. Ross (Judge Brack/Scene Design) is a founder and Co-Artistic Director of The Classic Theatre. For The Classic Theatre: Director and designer for *The Glass Menagerie* and *She Stoops to Conquer*, designer for *Uncle Vanya*, *Blithe Spirit* and *Hedda Gabler*. Acting roles for The Classic Theatre: Professor Serebryakov in *Uncle Vanya*, Joe Keller in *All My Sons*, Dr. Bradman in *Blithe Spirit* and King Henry II in *The Lion In Winter*. Mr. Ross has been honored by ATAC with 17 Globe Awards including their highest award, The Jasmina Wellinghoff Award for special contributions to theatre in San Antonio. He was recently honored by SATCO as a San Antonio Living Legend.

**Terri Peña Ross** (*Juliana*) graduated with a BA in Theatre from UT Austin and has a Masters in Directing from Southwest Texas State. She is a founding member of the Classic Theatre of San Antonio. She has taught theatre in high school and middle school for 20 years. Favorite roles include Amanda in *Glass Menagerie*, Vivian Bearing in *Wit*, Aggie in *Dancing at Lughnasa* and Kate in *All My Sons*. For the CTSA she has been stage manager, washer of costumes, prop gatherer, painter, and bathroom scrubber.

Andrew Thornton (George Tesman) has graced the Classic Stage in The Glass Menagerie and Waiting for Godot and has directed Uncle Vanya and Much Ado About Nothing. Andrew is an actor, director and teacher from San Antonio and graduated from the University of North Carolina School of the Arts. Locally, he has appeared in many productions at the San Pedro Playhouse including The Pillowman, The Hairy Ape and Book of Days; For AtticRep he has appeared in Lincolnesque, True West, The Goat or Who Is Sylvia; For Summer Rep, Rabbit Hole; and in Booth as the Stieren Guest Artist at Trinity University). Andy has directed <sup>4</sup> for The Company and Overtime Theatre.

#### Hedda Gabler- Act 4

Hedda represents anyone longing for identity. She is a brilliant, sophisticated woman trapped in a world that denies her the right to self-actualization. Some of the conventions of Ibsen's time have long since fallen out of fashion; but many of the same restrictions on the basic human right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness still exist in our society, and certainly societies abroad. As long as nations and families dictate to human beings what is appropriate to feel in their hearts; Hedda Gabler will resonate with great power.

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### PRODUCTION STAFF BIOS

Anthony Ciaravino (Director) has been seen on many stages across San Antonio. After graduating from UIW, he went on to earn an MFA in Acting from the professional actortraining program at the University of Minnesota. Following graduate school, he was a member of the acting company at the Guthrie Theater for 6 seasons. Roles at the Guthrie include Demetrius in A Midsummer Night's Dream, Don John in Much Ado About Nothing, and Trouble/Doctor in In the Blood. The roles Anthony has played in San Antonio are Hamlet, Romeo, and Macbeth. His directing credits in SA include Macbeth, A Midsummer Night's Dream, Resurrection Blues and Waiting for Godot. Currently, he is in charge of the Theater Arts curriculum in the Upper School at Keystone School.

Lucas Gerhardt (*Stage Manager*) is a student at San Antonio College and is graduating this spring. His most recent production was *Godspell* where he acted as Lighting Designer and Set Designer. Lucas was also the Stage Manager for *Much Ado About Nothing* with Classic Theatre and has been the board operator for Classic Theatre in *All My Sons* and *Waiting for Godot*. Lucas is thrilled to have been able to be a part of such wonderful productions and will miss Classic deeply as he moves to Oklahoma City to pursue his B.F.A in Lighting Design this coming fall.

Jodi Karjala (*Costume Designer*) marks her fourth costume design for Classic Theater with Hedda Gabler; previous shows being *She Stoops to Conquer, Much Ado About Nothing* and *Blithe Spirit.* Jodi is the Costume Designer and Costumer at Trinity University, and in San Antonio she has also designed costumes for AtticRep and the Cellar Theatre.

His sound and light designs have appeared on almost every stage in San Antonio and have garnered several ATAC Globe awards. Rick's sound designs have been selected for display at The World Stage Design 2005 in Toronto and 2009 in Seoul as well as for the Prague Quadrennial Expositon of Scenography in 2003 and 2007 and 2011. Rick is also the Director of Operations for Classic Theatre.
