

Directors

Adam Roberts is an award winning director and choreographer for companies, productions, and initiatives with choreography credits including two European concert tours. Adam's Austin production/faculty credits include: Austin Jewish Repertory Theater (Artistic Director), Long Center for the Performing Arts (Resident Musical Director), TILT Performance Group (Co-Artistic Director), Austin Conservatory of Theatre, Austin Shakespeare, Ballet Austin, Ground Floor, Paramount, The State Theatre School of Acting, TSP, Texas Arts Project, ZACH, Zilker, and more. Adam is musical

director of Music Theatre Online and Libretto with the NY Public Library for the Performing Arts, and was a writer for the Austin Chronicle. Adam serves as music director at St. Luke United Methodist Church, and is artistic director of The Final Acts Project, a national initiative employing the creative arts to facilitate end-of-life discussion. He holds a Master's degree in Music from Florida State University and received undergraduate degrees from Kent State University and Youngstown State University's Dana School of Music. In 2015, Adam received the Shalom Austin Staff Exemplar of Excellence Award for the creation and development of the AJRT.



Amy Downing is a member of First Austin and one of the founding dreamers of Trinity Street Players where she has performed in *Aria Da Capo, Inherit the Wind, Haunted Songs, Heralding the Holidays* in addition to directing *The Best Christmas Pageant Ever,* and now happily assistant directing *Into the Woods* with her own "listening children" in tow! Amy is an equity member who has received B. Iden Payne awards for her roles in *High School Musical* (ZACH), *Silence: The Musical* (Doctuhmistah), and an Austin Critics Table Award for her role in *In the Next Room* (ZACH). Here in Austin, she has also performed with Austin Playhouse, Penfold, Paper Chairs, Salvage Vanquard, The Mary Moody Northern theatre, and Austin Shakespeare. She also

played Sally Bowles in the national tour of *Cabaret*. However, her most cherished roles are mother to Ariana and Rebekah and wife to Grant.

From the Directors

Austinites have ventured Into the Woods several times over the past few years, in addition to 2014's Disney film adaptation of the now-classic musical.

It was while directing a previous production of Into the Woods that I (Adam) decided to try a new concept for the show should I direct it again: winter woods as a charcoal painting might suggest with black stick trees and frozen snowdrifts. So when Cathy Jones invited the AJRT to partner with TSP on Into the Woods following last summer's award-winning collaborative production of Fiddler on the Roof, I knew it was time to revisit the Woods... this time in winter.

It wasn't just the visual appeal of the seasonal shift that birthed this blustery reimagining. As I explored the themes of the show, I wondered what might happen if the foliage of the traditional setting were removed, leaving the characters with little to conceal themselves - physically or emotionally. Numerous times I found hiding or make one's presence known integral as a thread of characterization and storytelling. As Keith Gruber (Jack) pointed out during a cast character analysis discussion, defense mechanisms abound with the characters of *Into the Woods* – and, indeed, lay the framework for Sondheim and Lapine's Freudian approach to the writing of the musical. When Rapunzel desires to see the world, the Witch rebukes her, "Someone has to shield you from the world!" When defenses run high and resources low, how do we shield ourselves from the proverbial world of which the Witch speaks? Can our psyche become our own worst enemy, much like the wolves of the story?

Additionally, I (Ann) wanted to play further with the idea of identity. With "foliage" stripped away, who are we, really? "What if I am what a prince would envision?" Cinderella wonders – is it the dress, the dancing? What makes "bad guys" bad and "good guys" good? Could it be that how we see ourselves and the stories we tell about one another are merely narratives we hide behind?

If so many theatre companies mount *Into the Woods* (a typically expensive, large-scale endeavor), it stands to reason that the Brothers Grimm stories, and the particular lens through which Sondheim/Lapine tell them, must continue to hold significance in today's world. The questions posed by the musical are timeless: "Do you know what you wish?" "Are you certain what you wish is what you want?" In the end, we are reminded: "Careful the things you wish and do... and careful the tale you tell." A traditional end to a cautionary tale, but through the synthesis of music, text and circumstance, this piece retains a special magic for us today!
