

Note from the Playwright

The power is in the writing - that is one of the most important artistic lessons I have learned. My passion for writing grew out of desperation, really, because I knew that if I wanted good roles, I'd have to write them myself. So here it is - my first full-length play. My favorite thing about the script is the double meaning in the title. On one hand, the play is about figurative tracking in the way that family members know all about each other's personal business, and on the other hand it's literally about tracking in that it deals with the technology of human micro-chipping. It brings me great joy to be able to share the work with you. I thank Teatro Vivo for making it all possible.

In my life, I have been fortunate to encounter many talented people. One of the most important was my junior high school drama teacher, Albert "Beto" Garza, who is also the namesake for the lead male character in Keeping Track. Beto was killed in a bus accident while on vacation in Mexico in 2009. He was an inspiration to me and one of the people who helped shape my life. It is my honor to dedicate this production to his memory.
