Production Team Bios

Jason Amato (Lighting Designer) - Jason's career has spanned 18 years, designing over 500 local and international shows. He is the resident lighting designer for ZACH, Austin Shakespeare, Blue Lapis Light, and VORTEX Repertory Company. The Austin Critics' Table has honored Jason for outstanding lighting in 25 shows. He has also received B. Iden Payne Awards for his lighting of Troades, Trickster, Triskelion, Panoptikon, Despair's Book of Dreams and the Sometime Radio, and The Deluge at The VORTEX and The Exonerated and Omnium-Gatherum at Zach. In 2002 he was honored with "Best Dazzler" in The Austin Chronicle's Critics' poll. In 2008, Jason received the "Outstanding Contribution to Austin Theater" award from Austin Circle of Theaters. www.jasonamato.com

Bonnie Cullum (Producing Artistic Director) has created and presented over 300 innovative productions for VORTEX Repertory Company and has been inducted into the Austin Arts Hall of Fame. She has a long relationship with LEAR, having portrayed Goneril as a teenager, directed King Lear for VORTEX in 1991, and now producing Rudy's new version. She earned an MFA in Directing (University of Texas) and a BA in Theatre (University of Kansas). Thrice honored as Austin's Best Director by the Austin Chronicle, Cullum has been nominated for dozens of outstanding directing awards and received B. Iden Payne Awards for Best Director for Troades: The Legend of the Women of Troy, Moby Dick, and Despair's Book of Dreams and the Sometimes Radio. She is internationally recognized for her experimental productions and her advocacy of cutting-edge artists.

Ann Marie Gordon (Scenic Designer) has a BFA in Painting from the University of Texas and has been the resident scenic designer for VORTEX Repertory Company since 1997. She received B. Iden Payne Awards for Outstanding Scenic Design for VORTEX's Sleeping Beauty, St. Enid and the Black Hand, The Deluge, and Despair's Book of Dreams and the Sometimes Radio. She also designed the scenery for dozens of other world premiere VORTEX productions including The Elementals: AIR, Oceana, Trickster, Vampyress, Wake for the Dark Poet, Dark Goddess, The X&Y Trilogy, and Elytra, as well as numerous Summer Youth Theatre productions.

Sergio R. Samayoa (Video and Sound Design) wrote original music and sound design for over 50 theatre shows as VORTEX company member between 1990 and 2000 and won several awards for best sound design including the B. Iden Payne First Choice Award and the Austin Critics' Table award. Other credits include original music for Ariel Dance Theatre and original composition and video as a guest artist at McNeese State University. Sergio worked for Nemesys Music Technology, now Tascam, and was on the development team for the industry standard software sampler Gigastudio. He toured the world as a product specialist showing the software at trade shows from Los Angeles to Frankfurt, Germany. Sergio moved to NYC in 2001 where he came to work closely with most of the top composers in the New York City area and has been closely involved with productions including the Yugioh movie and the Lizzie McGuire movie and several national commercials. Since returning to Austin a few years ago, he has co-written, produced, and performed in the 2009 production of SPACEMAN.DADA.ROBOT, IN.CAR.NATION, SURFIN' UFO, and Planet of the Mermaids with the Electronic Planet Ensemble and created original video for the ethos' XEPHYRA.

Cast Bios

Suzanne Balling (Cordelia) - Suzanne returns to The VORTEX after playing the 13th Faery in last spring's production of *Sleeping Beauty*. Other Austin roles include Rosie in *Humble Boy*, Titania in *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, Doris in *Dead White Males* (2010 B. Iden Payne and Austin Theater Examiner nominations), Mom/Penny in *The Long Now*, Maryamma in *Miss Witherspoon* (2009 B. Iden Payne award), and Olivia in *Twelfth Night*.

David J. Boss (France/Ensemble) - While at UT, David trained with the Shakespeare at Winedale program where he played such parts as Falstaff (ii Henry IV), Duke Vincentio (Measure for Measure), and Cornwall (King Lear). Over the past three years, he has worked year-round with many theater companies in Austin. He is a regular performer with Austin Shakespeare seen most recently as Antonio (The Tempest) and has collaborated on more than one occasion with Breaking String as Volodya (Flying) and Yasha (The Cherry Orchard).

Jennifer Coy (Regan) - Jennifer is a two-time B. Iden Payne award nominee and Shakespeare at Winedale alumnus. She most recently appeared in *The Elementals: Air* with VORTEX Repertory and Trey Deason's *Cardigan* for FronteraFest. She has also worked with City Theatre, NXNW Theatre Company, and the Georgetown Palace. In other words, she has spent her entire career trying to bury her East Texas twang under proper diction, sacred texts, and iambic pentameter. Eternal love and gratitude to this extraordinary cast-loveyoumeanit!

Mick D'arcy (Gloucester) - Mick is a long-time VORTEX Company member. Favorite roles include Travis Flood in *A Ghost From A Perfect Place*, Cyrano de Bergerac in the same, Maurice in *Disney's Beauty and the Beast* and John Wayne Gacy in *Killers*. He has received six B. Iden Payne nominations and one Critics' Table nomination.

Trey Deason (Oswald/Ensemble) - Trey last appeared at The VORTEX in *The Secret Lives of the Inbetweeners* (B. Iden Payne Nomination, Best Supporting Actor). Other recents acting credits include *Hamlet* (Osric- Black Swan Productions), *An Inspector Calls* (Different Stages), and in his own original play, *Cardigan*. It's nice to take a walk in the rain.

Joseph Garlock (Burgundy/Ensemble) - Joseph is making his VORTEX debut in *Lear*. Most recently, he performed in *Much Ado About Nothing* with Present Company Theatre. Other credits include *Comedy of Errors, Twelfth Night, Henry V, Pippin, West Side Story,* and *Angels in America*. All love and thanks to Perckle and a defiant shake of the fist to Jim Michael Verda, his archnemesis.

Micah Goodding (Edmund) - Micah Goodding has been active in the arts for nearly ten years as a puppeteer, director, educator and classically trained actor. His students have performed at state competitions. He has acted with Texas Shakespeare Festival and in national commercials. Recently he filmed a documentary in India. He holds a double Bachelor's in Theatre & Art from SFASU. In August, Micah will be attending the East 15 Acting Conservatoire in London. He credits all of the above to Mom and Dad and Him.

Shannon Grounds (Fool) - Shannon is the Producing Artistic Director of Shrewd Productions, a core company member of Hyde Park Theatre, and an alumnus of Austin Shakespeare. Recent credits include MilkMilkLemonade, Feast of Fools and The Long Now with Shrewd Productions, 69 Love Scenes with Gnap! Theatre, God's Ear with Biophiliac Productions, As You Like It for Scottish Rite Theatre, and a couple of stints on the popular website Project Rant. Other Shakespearean credits include Viola in Twelfth Night for Scottish Rite, Lavinia in Titus Andronicus for Austin Shakespeare, Margaret and Beatrice in Much Ado About Nothing for Austin Shakespeare and The Company, respectively, Phebe in As You Like It for Zach Scott, Cordelia in King Lear and Marianna in Measure for Measure. Shannon has received multiple B. Iden Payne, Austin Critics' Table and Austin Theatre Examiner nominations/awards for her work. Her next project will be Thirst: a spell for Christabel coming to the Long Center this Fall.

Chelsea Manasseri (Ensemble) - Chelsea Manasseri is no stranger to the VORTEX stage. You may recognize her from the 2010 productions of *Sleeping Beauty* (Yyola the Magician) and *Vampyress* (King Matthias). Locally, Chelsea has performed with The Gilbert & Sullivan Society, The Georgetown Palace Theatre, and Sam Bass Theatre, just to name a few. In 2009 Chelsea graduated from Michigan's Oakland University with a BA in Musical Theatre. While at OU, Chelsea performed in a wide range of musicals and plays, including *Chekhov in Yalta* (Masha Chekhov), *A Year with Frog & Toad* (Mouse), and *Crumbs from the Table of Joy*, in which her performance as Lily Ann Green earned her an Irene Ryan Award nomination. Toby Minor (Albany) - Toby received his B.A. training from NMSU. He is a certified Actor Combatant with the Society of American Fight Directors (SAFD), and a black belt Ninja, and has choreographed fights for various shows and films around town, including *Hamlet* with Black Swan Productions. Toby has also had roles in *A Brilliant Revolution* with Debutantes and Vegabonds, and *Spirits to Enforce with Cap T* as well as a few student films. Toby is represented by DVA Talent.

Mindy Rast (Ensemble) - This is Mindy's ninth production at The VORTEX, the past six being as a company member. She won an ensemble B. Iden Payne for *Troades*, and her latest credits include *Planet of the Mermaids* (Merra), *Vampyress* (Darvulia), and the non-Vortex production *The Story Seekers* (General). Tom Truss (Cornwall) - Tom returned to school in 2007 to obtain an MFA in acting from the University of Texas at Austin. Before attending UT he had a twenty year career as a dancer that included touring nationally and internationally with the Liz Lerman/Dance Exchange, various companies, and as a solo artist. He also created and directed his own dance company, became certified as a teacher of the Alexander Technique and obtained an MFA in dance from the University of Iowa. Prior to his career in dance he graduated from the College of Wooster with a Bachelor of Music degree in piano performance. Tom received the Austin Critics Table award as best actor, been nominated for a B Iden Payne and was honored with the examiner.com best featured actor award last year.

She is the artistic director and founder of Biophiliac Productions, as well as a professional makeup artist and film actor.
