## **Directors' Notes**

Edgar Allen Poe is considered the father of the modern detective story, but artists of all kinds owe him a great debt. What we've come to think of as "black comedy" was largely influenced by Poe's grotesque (and underappreciated) comedy, whether in the form of a humorous essay or infused as pithy relief in his Gothic horror stories. Poe's importance can be felt far and wide across the artistic spectrum, from Batman to *Lost*, Stanley Kubrick to Tim Burton, *The Maltese Falcon* to Dean Koontz. Suffused with stories within stories, *The Barrel of Beauregard Vintage '72* is a zany tribute to the varied and spectacular influence Poe has had on modern storytellers.

The Tell Tale Heart, like many other of Poe's masterpieces, envelopes the audience with the agitated mind of a protagonist on the precipice of madness. When a traumatic encounter with a desperate criminal leaves Mary with an overly developed sense of hearing the boundaries between beauty and horror, pain and pleasure, sanity and perception all start to blur. Add a concerned and helpless spouse and an overbearing physician into the equation and we start to wonder where Mary's condition leaves off and her reality begins. For me this pieces has raised some interesting questions about what traumas may have formed my own senses and perceptions. I hope it speaks to you.
