Director's Musings on Edgar Allan Poe & Nevermore

Much of what you will see on stage tonight is factual with some dramatic license. You are at the theatre after all. To prevent this from being a five-hour long biography. Jonathan Christenson, the creator of Nevermore, has wisely touched on the key dramatic events in Poe's life so we can possibly see the influential moments that most likely inspired some of his greatest works. Christenson has also woven some of Poe's most iconic writings into the narrative through the Nightmare sequences and songs: Metzengerstein's Horse, The Pit and the Pendulum, The Tell Tale Heart, Israfel, A Dream within a Dream, and, of course. The Raven. If you get lost between reality and fiction, we encourage you to just sit back and enjoy the journey....Welcome to Nevermore!

Some notes on the life and career or Edgar Allan Poe

Edgar Allan Poe (1809-1949) is considered by many to be one of the central figures of Romanticism in American literature. He is known primarily as a poet and one of the first practitioners of the short story. Praised by such writers as Sir Arthur Conan Doyle (Sherlock Holmes), Jules Verne and H.G. Wells, Poe is also considered one of the forefathers of the detective story and the genre of science fiction. Although we most closely associate him with gothic themes, he also wrote satires, hoaxes and humorous tales. In addition, he was highly regarded for his literary criticism.

Born in Boston, Poe's professional career took him to New York, Philadelphia, Richmond and Baltimore. Nevermore mentions Edgar attending college (University of Virginia), which he attended for one year. Our show fails to mention that he also attended West Point to appease Jock Allan (and from which arranged his own court martial). While under the care of the Allans, he also attended boarding school in Scotland and England.

In Nevermore, we also mention the deaths to love ones in his life: His mother, Eliza, to tuberculosis when he was two years old; Fanny Allan, his beloved foster mother, at age 20; brother Henry Poe to tuberculosis when he was 22 years old; his cousin and wife, Virginia "Sissy" Clemm, to tuberculosis after 11 years of marriage. Details of his own death are greatly disputed and theories range from influenza to cholera to rabies.
