


Cast

Director's Notes

I first saw David Auburn's *Proof* back in 2003 and happened to be in graduate school at the time working on my master's degree in mathematics. I was mesmerized by it. I found it to be (in Hal's words) "streamlined, no-wasted moves, like a 95-mile-an-hour fastball." As one who knows the challenge first hand of crafting such an elegant, beautiful proof (or piece of code, or poem, or song, or novel, or piece of art, or ...), I was ecstatic when the opportunity came up for me to direct this brilliant piece. But the truth is, this isn't a math play. It's there, sure, floating on the surface, adding texture and context, but deep down there is so much more. There are these rich, fascinating characters, each with multiple layers of complexity and dimension, some dimensions that are large and obvious, others that are tiny and curled up so small that we can only feel their effect but can't see them. And at the center of all of this is Catherine, this amazina, remarkable person, so flawed, so helpless, so damaged, and yet so strong and so gifted. Her journey takes us into some dark corners and forces us to look at ourselves and our own genius, madness, trust, healing, forgiveness, and inner strength. Most of all, though, it is the relationships in this piece that stand out. I myself am rather partial to the scenes with Catherine and her father Robert. My kids haven't learned yet that math (at least for most people) isn't "cool," and they love doing it with me. But no matter who you are (math lover or math hater), someone in this play will resonate with you and your story. And maybe, like Catherine, you too will discover a glimmer of hope and a new beginning.


