

# Youth Workshop Begins May 23

Temple Civic Theatre will be offering a **Youth Theatre Workshop** directed by **Betsi Chamlee** beginning on May 23. Our workshop show, *Serious Fun: A Celebration of Dr. Seuss*, adapted by Kathy Owens, is a compilation of several of Dr. Seuss's books with some biographical information thrown in.



The show has roles for 15-30 students; the roles are of varying difficulty, so performers of all levels of experience can be involved in this show. Cost for the three weeks is \$195 per student, with Temple Civic Theatre season members receiving a \$175 discounted price.

Performances are June 10-11-12. Reserved seat tickets are \$8 for adults and \$5 for children (14 and under).

## **Rocky Horror Show Auditions**



Open auditions for a special production of Richard O'Brien's The Rocky Horror Show musical will be Sunday and Monday, May 29 and 30, at 7 p.m. at the theatre. Director will be Natasha Tolleson.

Roles include Usherette, Brad, Janet, Narrator, Riff Raff, Columbia, Magenta, Frank'n'Furter, Rocky, Eddie, Dr. Scott, and Phantoms (chorus). Rocky should be a young muscular man who will appear onstage in only posing shorts. Due to overlapping rehearsal schedules, people cast in Seussical will only be eligible to be one of the Phantoms.

Auditioners are asked to prepare a

brief song (32 bars or less) that shows off their voice. We'll have an audition pianist and a CD player on hand, but you may also bring your own accompanist or CD player. There will be a simple movement exercise — so wear comfortable clothes. There will also be cold readings from the script.

The four performances will be Friday and Saturday, August 12 and 13. We'll have two shows each night — at 8 p.m. and 11 p.m.

Sing-through will be June 2. Music rehearsals begin June 6. Rehearsals will be throughout the summer. Please review the online rehearsal schedule before auditions and write any time conflicts on your audition form.
