Iden Payne award) and Rosie Pye in *Humble Boy* for Different Stages, Doris in *Dead White Males* (B. Iden Payne and Austin Examiner nominations, ALT Applause) for Sustainable Theatre Project, Titania in *A Midsummer Night's Dream* and Sister Bigtits in *The Bawdy Five* for the Baron's Men, and Olivia in *Twelfth Night* for Scottish Rite Theatre. She has also performed in New York, Boston, Houston, and (going way back) her hometown of Galveston. Suzanne would like to dedicate this weekend's performances to her old neighbors at Ladder 5 Engine 24 of Greenwich Village.

Scot Friedman has appeared on stage and screen and has voice-over credits in animation, film, commercial, and theatrical productions. Past performances include *The Imaginary Invalid* (City Theatre), *Of Mice and Men* (City Theatre), *The Night of the Iguana* (Different Stages), *Two Rooms* (Rapscallions of the Periphery, 2010 Austin Theatre Examiner nomination for best lead actor in a drama), *The Taming of the Shrew* (Hidden Room, 2010 B. Iden Payne winner for outstanding production of a comedy), *How the Other Half Loves* (City Theatre), and *Laughter on the 23rd Floor* (City Theatre). Look for him in December in a production of *Burn This* (Seven Towers).


Director's Note
